#### Meeting Notes:

SDHHC quarterly member meeting completed in person and virtually. Attendance was recorded.

#### Welcome & Announcements

Provided by Davis Schofield, CoC Administrator. Homeless Summit is set for June 14-15 at Oacoma, SD. Planned theme is Wellness but there will a variety of speaks and activities. Attendees were asked to please mute when not speaking. Vast majority of attendees were virtual. Attendance recorded in SKYPE Chat text, via email, sign in sheet at venue.

#### HOME - ARP

Provided by Chas Olson, Director of Rental Housing Development, SDHDA. SD was allocated about \$9.3 million in funding. CPD Notice 21-10. No Match requirement. Funds must e used by September 2030. Eligible activities include; Affordable rental housing, Tenant Based Rental Assistance, Supportive Services, Non-congregate shelter. Qualifying populations included people experiencing homelessness (24 CFR), At-risk, Fleeing Domestic e violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, Other populations. Plans being developed for the allocation of these funds. Please provide comments to Chas Olson. Michelle Running Wolf asked a clarifying question about grant dates and activities, application time period, location of application. Joe Barb asked questions about shelter and permanent housing acquisition options under HOME-ARP.

## CoC Competition - Tribal Consultation

Provided by Davis Schofield. Background was provided on what is CoC. Promoted by US Dept. Housing & Urban Development, to end homelessness by community collaboration. Supported by

HUD CoC funding. Organized community response. Promotes HUD best practices approaches. More information on many related topics at HUD Exchange. Information on SD CARES rental, utility and mortgage assistance was provided. As of March 3, 2022 about \$25,000,000 has been provided for assistance in SD.

New Project Applicants are sought for 2022 CoC Competition. If interested, start now by locating info being HUD Exchange and talking with Davis about your ideas. South Dakota Housing for the Homeless Consortium (SDHHC) - SD-500 CoC is soliciting applications from new agencies & those currently receiving CoC funding interested in providing new innovative housing opportunities designed to successfully resolve homelessness experiences for individuals & families. Process was explained. The Continuum of Care establishes local competition to rate & rank projects applications.

Applicants submit project application to CoC & CoC either rejects or accepts & ranks based on rating & ranking tool. The CoC submits CoC application & all project applications to HUD for review HUD reviews & ensure they meet threshold requirements & scores CoC applications. Project applications funded based on combination of CoC score & how the CoC ranked the project. Project types were described. Past applications can be viewed at <a href="https://www.hosingforthehomeless.com">www.hosingforthehomeless.com</a>. An explanation of project funded for 2021 was provided. See chart in slides.

In 2021 CoC NOFO, Tribes and Tribal Housing were listed as eligible project applicants and eligible collaborative applicants. 2022 CoC NOFO, guidance about Tribes joining existing CoCs or forming new. 2022 HUD Notice – CoC Program Registration, Tribes and TDHEs must register by 5 PM April 7, 2022 deadline to establish own CoC. Tribes need provide Tribal Resolution to join SD-500 CoC by April 4, 2022. There was discussion about the implications and Pauletta Red Willow asked questions about requirements for CoC. Anita Deranleau provided information on difficulty of completing requirements including HMIS. A third in a series of Tribal – CoC Consultation Meetings is set for April 20, 2022 via SKPE. Please help us to invite Tribal officials, housing authorities, organizations providing homelessness related services in Tribal Areas.

#### YHDP & CoC Activity Report

Provided by Davis Schofield. YHDP activities are moving quickly. YAB is the center of these efforts. Planning Grant has been awarded. Technical Assistance continues several times for week. Coordinated Community Plan is due on April 15, 2022. Requests for Proposals for YHDP grants will be coming soon about May 6.

Longitudinal Systems Analysis (LSA), System Performance Measurements (SPM), PIT Count – Report Due Date April 29, Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) Changes, CoC, ESG, YHDP (no more DUNS #) March 29, 2022 update deadline. HMIS Expansion 80% Emergency Shelter beds. New HMIS enrollments 2221 (2020) to 4304 (2021)

Returns to homelessness 40% last 2 years up from 24% in 2020. Data Quality Importance was discussed. Many new users & new agencies in HMIS last 24 months.

Stephanie Marshall, CES Admin. SDHDA. CES committee members were presented. Performance report for 12/1/21 to 2/28/22 was provided. 207 enrollments in Homeless Prevention (59 Oct-Nov) 266 total. 221 enrollments in CE.72% female head of households.15% chronic. 55% reported disability. Data available via slides. What is next? Expansion of access, training & supporting new partners. Decreased wait time for assessment, evaluating referrals & housing capacity. Updated Marketing Materials. Housingforthehomeless.org Engaging those with lived experience. HUD Spring Workshop Series: CES Prioritization & Assessment.
