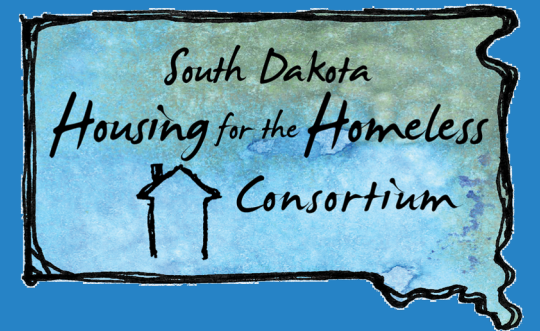

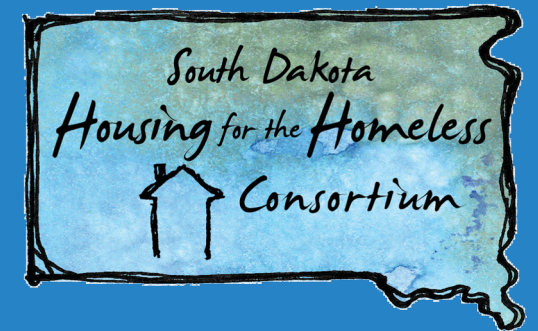
SDHHC Membership

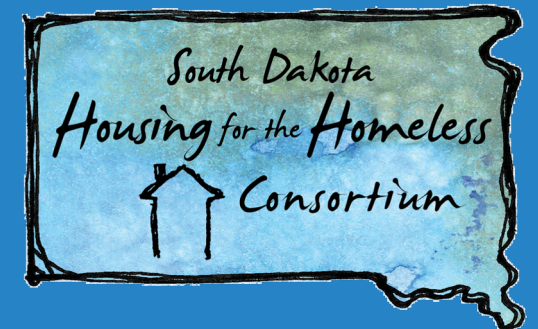

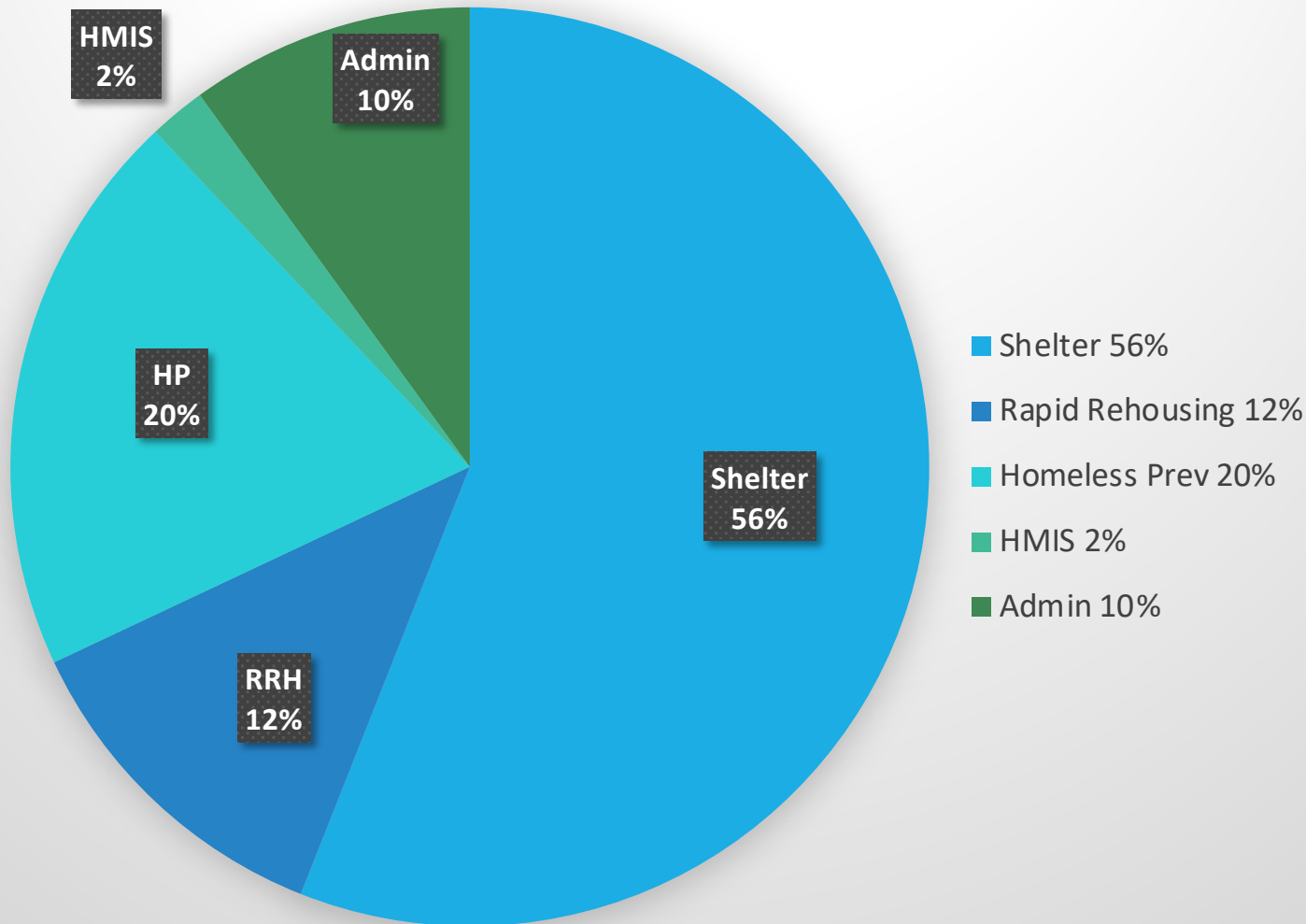


2020 Traditional ESG Funding

- ❖ Total Grant \$637,969
- ❖ Awarded 9/14/20
- ❖ Expires 2/14/22
- ❖ Will recapture & reallocate if needed
- ❖ 17 subrecipients across the state
- ❖ 1 new subrecipient to ESG
- ❖ Current reimbursements total \$116,788.97 which is 18.3% of the funding.

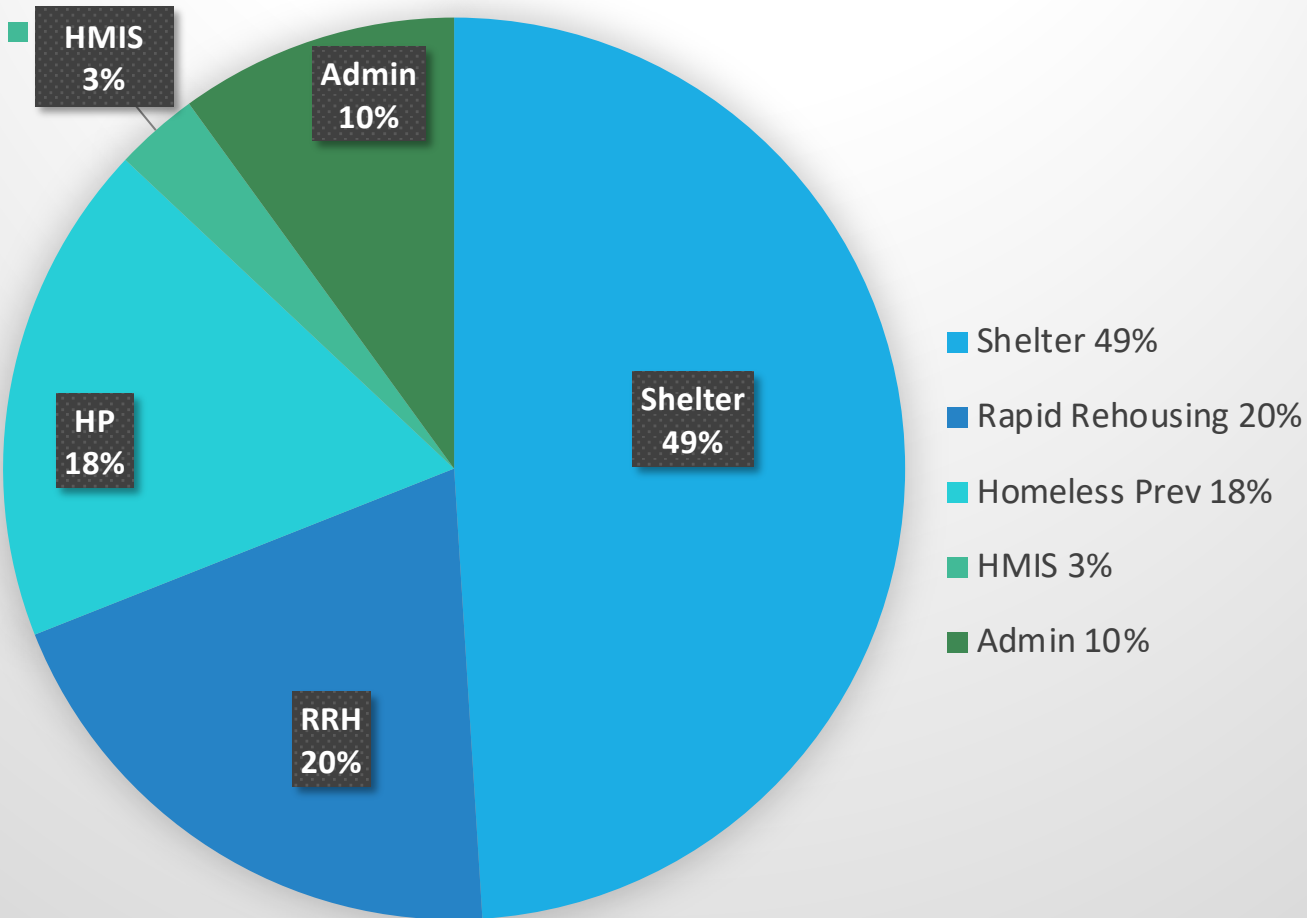


ESG-CV 1st Allocation Funding

- ❖ Total Award \$2,199,893
- ❖ Awarded 6/12/20
- ❖ Expires 9/30/22
- ❖ 9 subrecipients across the state
- ❖ 3 new subrecipients to ESG
- ❖ HUD's Expenditure Deadlines
 - 20% by 9/30/21
 - 80% by 3/30/22
 - 100% by 9/30/22

ESG-CV 2nd Allocation Funding

- ❖ Total Award \$5,554,958
- ❖ Split funding in 2 rounds
 - General application round **\$3,916,218** *was \$4,166,218 - we did a \$1M set aside for agencies providing services to Tribal Communities. Did not receive any requests so moved \$250,000 to the Pilot Project round
 - **Pilot Project round \$1,638,740**
- ❖ Awarded February & April 2021
- ❖ Expires 9/30/22
- ❖ 17 subrecipients across the state
- ❖ 9 new subrecipients to ESG

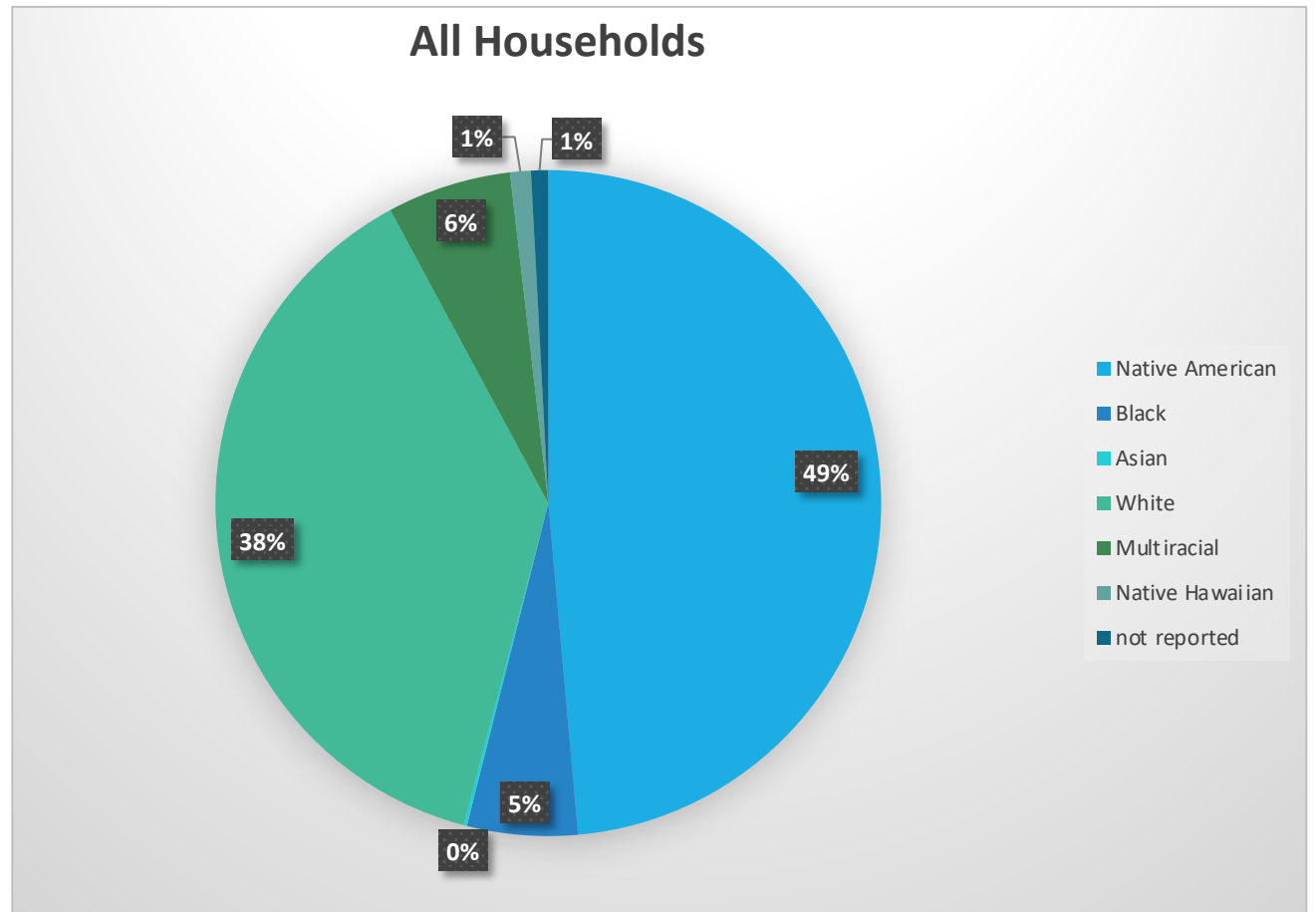

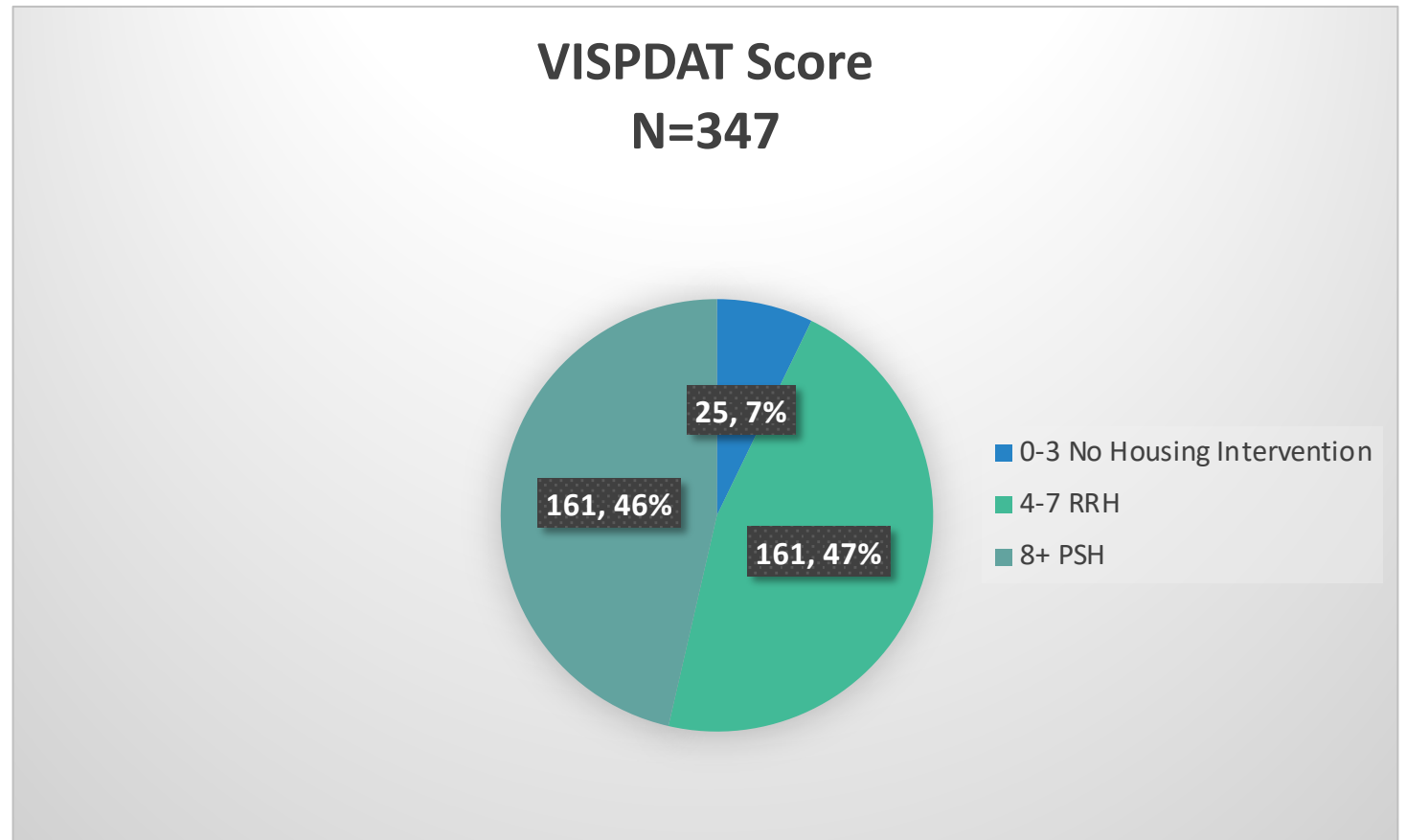
- 597 Households served

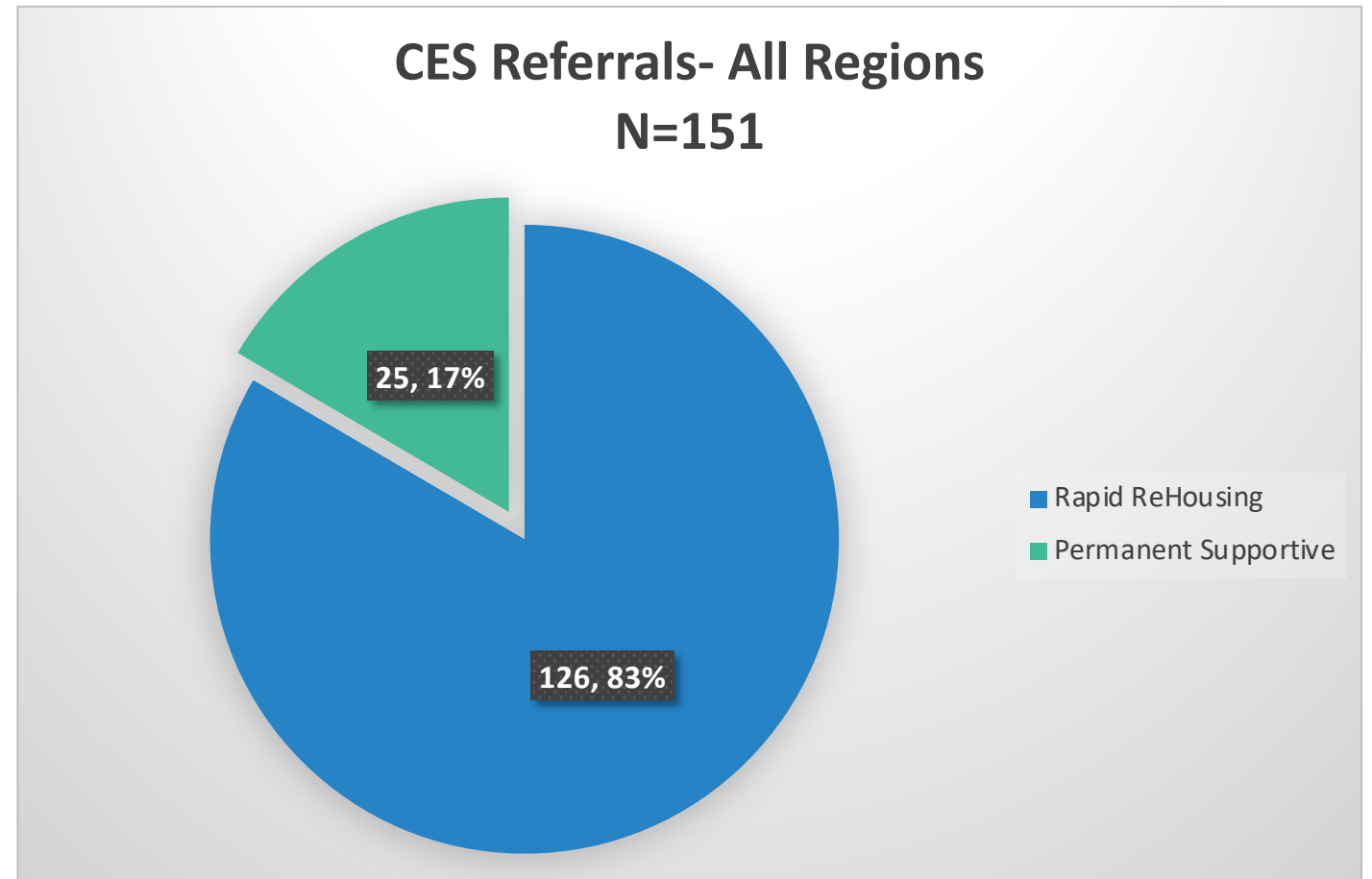
- 347 households enrolled

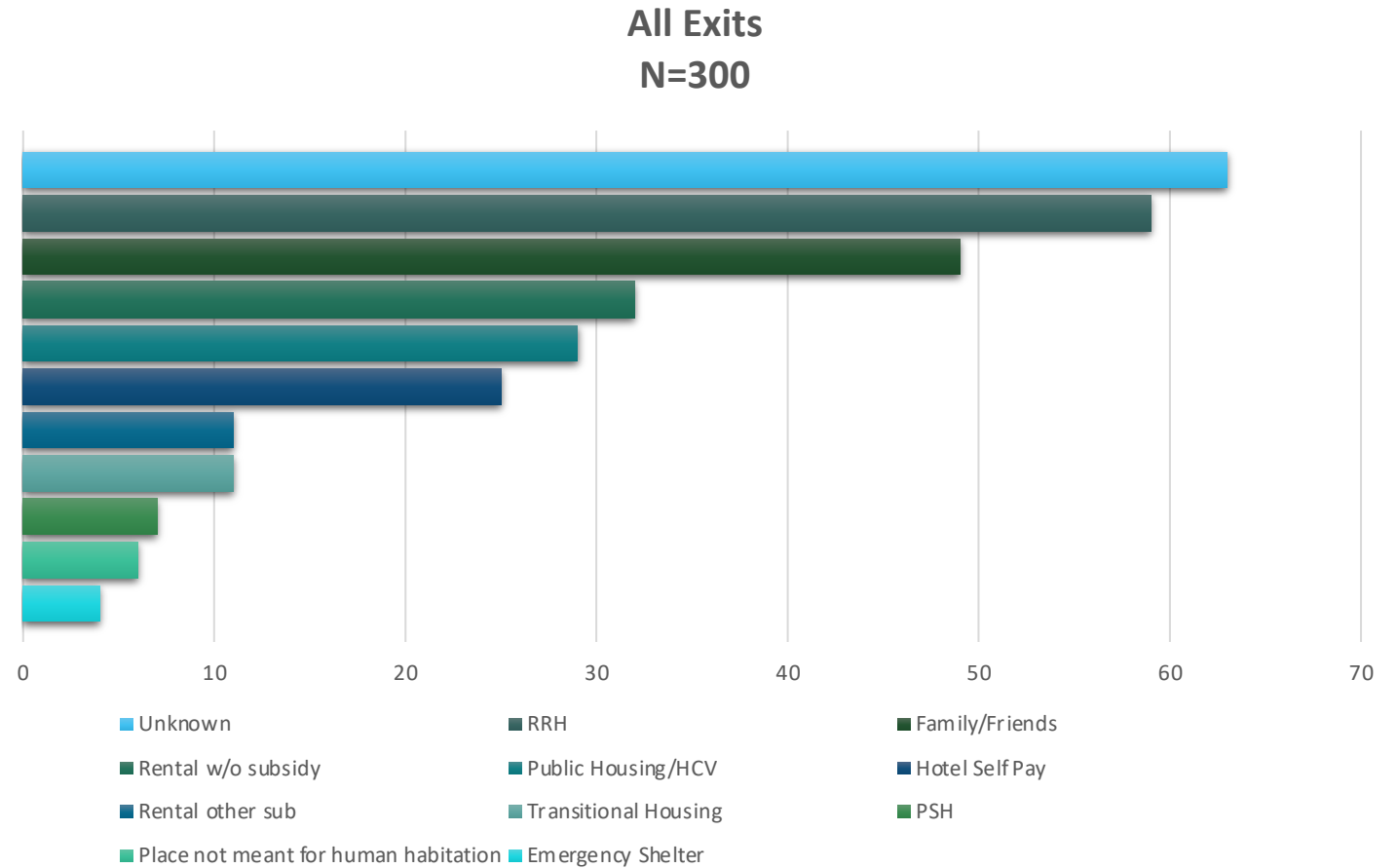
- 83% Referrals RRH

Coordinated Entry System

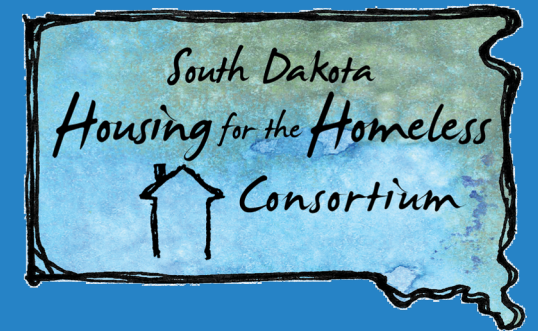
- CES Expansion
 - ESG CV- Outreach & Rapid ReHousing
 - Increase access and referral capacity
 - Homeless Prevention
 - Includes At Risk Households
 - Emergency Housing Vouchers-PHA partnership
 - Sioux Falls, Watertown, Pierre, Vermilion
 - Literally homeless, At Risk, Victims of sexual assault/human trafficking & Recently Homeless (RRH)

Next Steps in evaluation

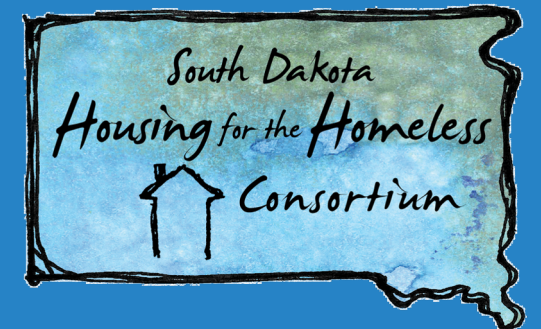
- **Access:** low barrier, timely, responsive special populations
- **Assessment:** reflective of household needs
- **Prioritization:** balancing need/capacity
- **Referral:** timely connection housing solutions

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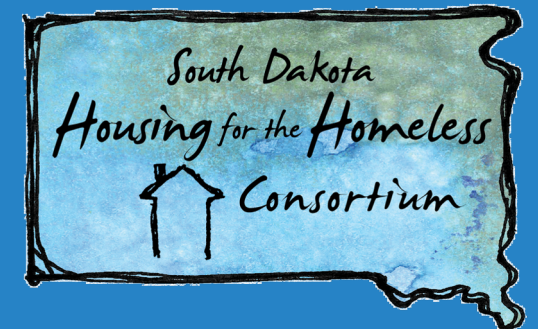
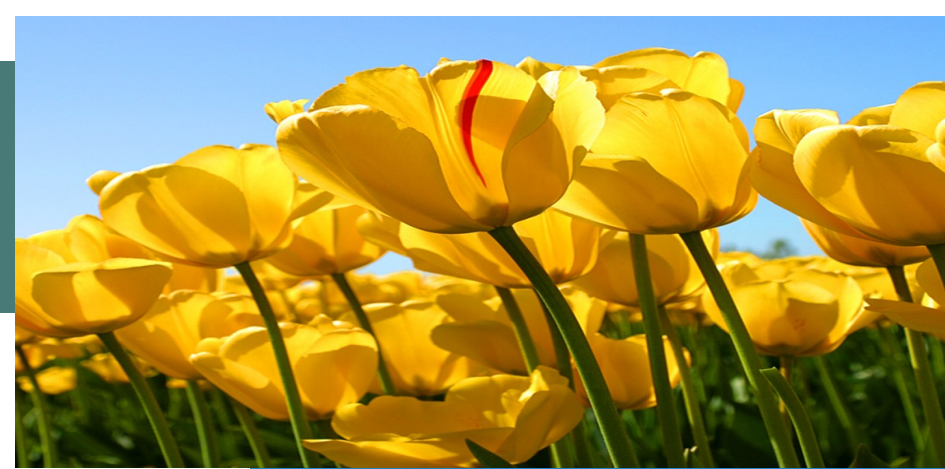
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2021 PAC Elections

2 PAC Positions are open with terms expiring

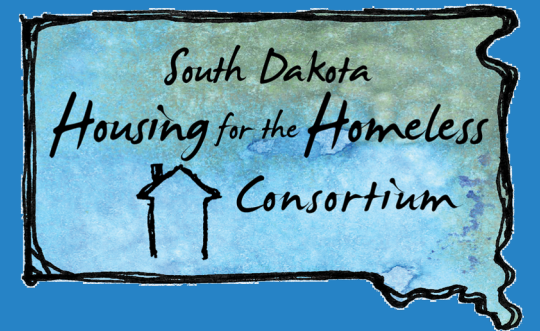
- 4 Year Terms
